# Library Board of Trustees October 24, 2022

- The meeting of the Village Library Board of Trustees was called to order at 6:05pm on Monday, October 24 2022, by Anne Bohara.

#### Present

- Lauren Nappi, Knicki Knickerbocker, Kate Shuhler, Holli Schrom, Anne Bohara, and Maria Long, Aaron Bostelle.

## **Aaron Books Presentation:**

- Aaron brought his consignment agreement with two options for the sale. A higher percentage after a sale (30 percent of gross per month), or a percentage prior (18 percent of gross).
- We would need to make a decision and have the contracts signed by November 1st.
- He currently has 75 books from the Library that were being stored in the shed.
- Book Sale can still be profitable with the leftover books that Aaron is not able to sell (rare and collectable).

#### Acceptance of the last meeting's minutes

- The minutes of September were approved.
- Motion made by Holli and seconded by Knicki. The motion passed with unanimous consent.

#### Correspondence

- Letter from the Berks County Library System sent a notification to the Library Board encouraging us to attend community events and increase community awareness.
- The State Aid budget has passed.
  - \$60,241 budget passed for 2023.
  - The money from State Aid will be used for salary and for staffing purposes.
  - Motion made by Knicki, seconded by Lauren. Motion passed with unanimous consent.

#### Director's Report

#### **Library Operations**

- Uniform requirements need to be handed in before December 31. Deadline for me is December 15 due to vacation time after Christmas.
- Plans for state aid needs to be submitted to Becky by October 31

- Emily from County has graciously offered to help with the yearly donation campaign and done a mock up for us. We can add or change anything we would like.

  Templates will be there every year. We just submit photos and what we want to highlight each year.
  - By September every year we will work Emily to create this template
  - Friend's group will tackle the mailing for this
- New patrons number is at 211 we will officially beat 2019's number
- Holiday hours to submit for 2023 library can only have a total of 12 holiday closings.
  - With the Contingency plan, we are proposing we lean on using the 10 week seasonal reduction hours for the summer, our most expensive time of the year.
  - With the waiver that was granted to us for 2021-2022, staff and I were discussing shortening hours during the December holiday season. Maria will be meeting with Becky on 10/31 to discuss options and to make sure we stay compliant with library regulations etc and not cause future detriment to our finances. She offered to go over finances and anything else we would need.

  - Easter Saturday 4/7
  - Memorial Day weekend 5/27-5/29
  - July 4th
  - Labor Day Weekend 9/3-9/4
  - Thanksgiving 11/23
  - Black Friday 11/24
  - Christmas Eve/Christmas 12/23/-12/25
  - And one day is set for BCPL staff training typically in the spring.
- In November we will be voting on the closing dates for 2023 in November
- Berks County Public Libraries Annual Awards for 2022 nominations can be submitted.
